MEMO TO THE STAFF. ) know ) speak for all of us when I say what a great moment this is for The Washington Post, Together with the New York Times, we have re-established a fundamental precept of freedom of the press under the First Amondment, For the first time in 200 years papers have been restrained from printing what, in the judgment of responsible editors here and elsewhere, was consulered legiturate news. It is a great trabute to the ability and determination of the

editors and reparters of this paper that we had a cuse that could be fought and won in the courts.

Without the incredible offert and teamwork of the entire organisation -- including the production and circulation departments who adjusted echedules right after night - . their efforts could not have succeeded,
