The Class of 1983 "Innovation and Great Work" Define Group

he Post welcomed 78 new members to the ranks of the 20-Year Club on Monday evening, Sept. 29 during a reception held for club members in the 9th floor community room in the Northwest Building. The new members were congratulated by Publisher **BO JONES** who thanked them for their years of service. He also reflected on what was happening at The Post 20 years ago. "It was a time when The Post was growing like crazy," said Jones. "If you look at the list of the new members of the 20-Year Club, you'll find the majority of them came from the mailroom and the pressroom...We used to think of The Post

20 years ago as this invincible juggernaut that was just growing and growing."

He also noted the changes in technology in the last two decades, citing the example of the infancy of cellular technology in 1983 to its prevalence today. "Technology has really changed." he said. "You think about the mailroom and the pressrooms, compared to 20 years ago and all the other changes at

"Thank you all for making this possible over 20 years," he added. "You've proved yourself through innovation and great work and

consistently put out the paper every day."

The class of 1983 brings the total number of 20-Year Club members who are actively employed at The Post to approximately 1,000, or just less than onethird of all Post employees. There are also an estimated 800 retirees who belong to the 20-Year Club. The 20-Year Club and the annual reception are coordinated by Vice President/Controller PEGGY SCHIFF and administrative assistant PAT HOLDSWORTH.
