Community Ties The Bureau Alliance Program

he Metro staff based at The Post's 13 local bureaus and offices are the newspaper's ties to the communities it serves in the metropolitan area. To enhance The Post's reputation and visibility in these communities, the Public Relations Department implemented the Bureau Alliance Program four years ago. According to Public Relations Manager LISA BOLTON, the program provides the opportunity for feedback and communication between the bureaus and the Northwest Building staff.

"It's a strategic and valuable way for us to find out about community concerns and initiatives," said Bolton. WILL

Through the Bureau Alliance Program, Public Relations Department staff are assigned to each of the local bureaus. Four times a year, the staff visit the bureaus and share feedback from their visits at a staff meeting. Feedback may include community issues, needs and concerns; public relations issues; community events that should be considered for sponsor-

ship, as well as compri opportunities to Richmo increase The Post's presence in the bureau's com-

munity that will have a positive impact on circulation.

Alliance Program has also enabled the bureaus to expand on existing community relationships. One example is the Fairfax Bureau's involvement with the Cappies high school theater program. Working

with the Public Relations Department, the bureau coordinates an annual daylong workshop for student theater critics hosted at the Northwest Building. (See the Oct. 9 issue of ShopTalk.)

Another objective of the Bureau Alliance Program is to strengthen the relationship between the bureaus and the Northwest Building. The Public Relations staff provides the bureaus with opportunities to participate in The Post's Speakers Bureau, as well as sharing publications, videos and other materials that may be useful to bureau staff.

The bureaus also receive

information on people in their counties who have been recipients of Post awards, including the Distinguished Educational Leadership Award for principals, the Agnes Meyer Outstanding Teacher Award, as well as local recipients of the newspaper's Grants
