A Capital Evening For The Post

ost employees spent a fun filled evening laughing, dancing and even shedding a couple of happy tears at the Capital Hilton in the District on Monday, Dec. 8 when more than 400 Post employees gathered for the 20th Annual Eugene Meyer Awards.

Chair **DON GRAHAM** and Publisher **BO JONES** presented The Post's highest employee honor to **TIEN DINH HOANG**, Production/Springfield Plant; **HOWARD "Bud" HUMPHRIES**, Advertising and **MARCIA KRAMER**, Newsroom.

The Eugene Meyer Award was established in 1983 on the 50th anniversary of Mr. Meyer's purchase of the newspaper on June 1, 1933 to annually recognize one or more employees who exemplify his seven principles for running a newspaper (see the Dec. 4 issue of ShopTalk).

Both Graham and Jones cited Tien Hoang for his tenaciousness at overcoming difficulties and obstacles to succeed in his life and in his career at The Post. Hoang was part of a group of Viet-

namese citizens who fled Vietnam during the fall of Saigon in 1975, settled in this area with their families and were subsequently hired by The Post.

In his remarks, Jones noted, "Throughout many changes [in the pressroom] Tien has been a rock of stability and a model of hard work and consistency...he is one tough guy."

Several vans filled with Hoang's coworkers from the Springfield Plant came to the awards ceremony to honor him. In his remarks, he thanked his managers, colleagues, and family for their support during his career, as well as the Daehnke family in Alexandria who sponsored his family when they came to the United States. He said, "Winning this award has been overwhelming for me. The calls from friends and coworkers have made me realize how very lucky I am. It is wonderful to be a part of The Washington Post family."

Bud Humphries, a former college and pro football player, remarked during the ceremony that he has played for a lot of teams, "some better than others, but none as good as The Washington Post."

"What is fundamental about Bud above all is that his [advertising] clients really respect him,

trust him and like him," said Jones. "He is a stickler for detail on his advertisers' behalf and will do all he can to make sure their ads run right. Bud simply loves his job and loves doing it."

Graham and Jones both credited Metro Copy Desk Chief Marcia Kramer for being a revitalizing force in the Newsroom and her contributions to the Metro copy desk. Jones called her a "terrific journalist with very high standards. She has transformed [the Metro copy desk] into a first-rate, highly regarded operation."

"Any organization is only as good as the people who

work there and that is where The Post truly excels," said Kramer in her remarks. "The Graham family is the rarest of newspaper owners, especially these days. That care and concern extends beyond the bylines to also value work that is done behind the scenes by people who don't have bylines... working together on behalf of readers helps make this newspaper great." ■
