# A Columnist's Lasting Legacy

arlier this month, local author Gail Spilsbury was looking through the shelves of the Washingtonia section of the District's Martin Luther King Library when she came upon what

> she believed to be a decaying treasure. It was a binder notebook filled with clippings by Robert Shosteck, The Post's outdoors columnist and editor from 1934 to 1935.

The clippings from his weekly hiking column include handdrawn hiking maps by Shosteck, who convinced The Post in spring 1934 to spon-

sor a hiking club for readers called the Wanderbirds. The success of this club led to his creation of the Capital Hiking Club in 1938. Both clubs are still active today, giving Shosteck the arguable title of the "father" of hiking in the Washington metropolitan area.

Currently on leave from her job as managing editor of books for the National Gallery of Art, Spilsbury

"As a researcher, I find the album a rich find because it appears to be an author's personal archive for his column and bookwriting. Each album page has a tiny tab identifying its locale: Prospect Rock, Great Falls, Burnt Mills, Billy



Goat Trail - so that the author could turn to that page quickly when planning a new hike, writing a new column, or writing a book entry," she noted.

"Shosteck contributed so much to the outdoors movement in D.C. and his legacy is still felt today, even if his name is forgotten. He stirred Washingtonians to get outdoors and discover the wonderful trails and Potomac scenery that's incredibly accessible to us," added Spilsbury. "He really started it all in the big way it exists today."

Robert Shosteck was in his early 20s when he ended his brief career as a forest ranger to become The

Post's outdoors columnist and editor in the mid 1930s, right after Eugene Meyer purchased The Post in 1933. After The Post, he went on to write several books on hiking and outings around the metro area. His books include *Trails* of the Potomac Valley: Chain Bridge to Great Falls, and Weekend Getaways around Washington, D.C.: Including Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, West Virginia, and North Carolina. The 2000 edition of Weekend Getaways includes a foreword by local celebrity and Today Show weatherman Willard Scott.

The Post's outdoors columnist Angus Phillips wrote about Shosteck in his column in January 1979, just months before Shosteck died of a heart attack at age 68, "Robert Shosteck made a trip to New York in the early 1930s and Washington has been richer since. In New York he took a hike with a group of German immigrants who called themselves "wanderbirds" after a hiking club in their native land. Shosteck enjoyed the walk and decided the nation's capital could stand a club like that."

#### **Newsroom Honors**

On Thursday, April 22, The Post reported that editorial cartoonist **Tom Toles** received the Overseas Press Club's Thomas Nast Award for best cartoons on international affairs. Pulitzer award winner **Anthony Shadid** received the club's Hal Boyle Award for best newspaper or wire service reporting from abroad.

The newspaper announced on Monday, April 19 that National Desk reporter **Howard Kurtz** won the Medill School of Journalism's Mongerson Prize for Investigative Reporting on the News. The Mongerson Prize honors outstanding reporting that uncovers and promptly corrects incomplete, inaccurate or misleading news stories. Kurtz was honored for breaking the story of *New* York Times reporter Jayson Blair's apparent plagiarism. Post Ombudsman

Mike Getler also received an award of distinction for his columns questioning The Post's coverage of the buildup to the war in Iraq and captured soldier Jessica Lynch.

On Wednesday, March 31, Pulitzer finalists Joe Stephens and David Ottaway were honored by the Investigative Reporters and Editors (IRE) Awards for their work on the "Big Green" series on questionable practices by the Nature Conservancy. They received a certificate in the category of newspapers with a circulation more than 500,000. The IRE is a 5,000 member professional organization.
