Security Reminders

he following is an update and reminder of important security information for employees:

Information Resources

- The emergency information line is (202) 334-7772. It gives recorded information about an ongoing emergency. If that line is not available for some reason, the backup number is (703) 914-7772.
- The Post has a dedicated Web page where information will be posted during a serious emergency. It is *http://rcmd.washpost.com/emergency.*
- If Post facilities are inaccessible or operations are otherwise affected by an emergency, each department has a plan in place for contacting individual employees by phone to give instructions about reporting to work.
 Please make sure your department has correct home and cell phone numbers for you.

- The U.S. Homeland Security Department's civil preparedness web site is *www.ready.gov* or you can call 1-800-237-3239 to receive brochures.
- Helpful information can also be found on the *Intraned* home page. Click on Security under "Departments."

Evacuations

- 1. Normal building evacuation (e.g., for fire or other emergencies). In a normal evacuation, the alarms will sound, and employees should leave the building immediately and report to their pre-assigned assembly locations (even if the alarm occurs outside regular working hours). Emergency coordinators and Security Department personnel will inform staff when it is safe to return. If you do not know your assembly location, please check with your supervisor or emergency coordinator as soon as possible.
- 2. City-wide or neighborhood evacuation. Some emergencies may cause government officials to direct people to evacuate a particular geographic area. If The Post receives such a directive for a Post building, we will relay information to employees over the PA system. Employees would be told to evacuate the area rather than report to their pre-assigned assembly

locations. During a citywide evacuation, normal routes may not be accessible. Information about what to do in the event of an emergency in D.C. can be found online at http://dcema.dc.gov/dcema/ site/default.asp

3. Containment. Some emergencies may cause the government to recommend that we stay inside the building rather than evacuate. The PA system, e-mail and other methods of communication will be used to keep employees as fully informed as possible.

Other Reminders

- Employees should wear IDs at all times in Post facilities.
- If you see or receive a suspicious package, contact the Security Department in your building immediately.
- In the event of an evacuation or other emergency, remember to take your red emergency pack with you.






