Policy for Use of Conference Rooms

With the completion of the new conference room space, it's an appropriate time to remind staff about the existing policy for the use of The Post's conference rooms and meeting space at the Northwest Building. Use of these spaces is limited to Post business meetings, Post business functions and Post-sponsored community or employee events. The conference spaces can not be used for non-Post business meetings or events (for example, alumni group or club meetings.) There are

multiple reasons for this policy including: business demands for existing conference space, space limitations in the Northwest Building due to construction, security concerns and the inability to selectively accommodate requests for use of these rooms for non-business purposes.
