# Coll Wins Pulitzer More Honors and Awards

ssociate Editor Steve Coll is the recipient of the 2005 Pulitzer Prize for general non-fiction for his book Ghost Wars: The Secret History of the CIA. Afghanistan and Bin Laden, from the Soviet Invasion to September 10, 2001. Executive Editor Len Downie announced the award, as well as the eight Post staff who are finalists in four categories, to a packed Newsroom on Monday, April 4.

This is Coll's second Pulitzer Prize. He received the journalism with Post reporter **David Vise** for a series they wrote on the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Coll was The Post's managing editor from 1998 until January when he stepped down to pursue his book writing. He came to The Post in 1985 and has also been a reporter, foreign correspon-

America. Dana Priest is a finalist in the beat reporting category for coverage of the operations of the U.S. intelligence and military after the September 11, 2001 attack and the war in Iraq. The team of reporters including Priest, Chris Davenport, Jeff Smith, Scott Higham, Joe Stephens and Josh White were finalists in national affairs reporting for coverage of the Abu Ghraib prison scandal. Editorial page writer **Sebastian** Mallaby was a finalist in editorial writing for his editorials on the genocide in the Darfur Region of the Sudan.

At a St. Patrick's Day party held in her honor, a plaque dedicated to The Post's columnist Mary McGrory was hung in the U.S. Senate Press Gallery. McGrory worked at The Post from 1981 until shortly before her death last year. The inscription on the plaque reads: "Mary McGrory 1918-2004. A friend who inspired us over the years

McGrory was also recently honored by Congressional Quarterly, which presented a \$2,500 check and plaque to Editorial Editor Fred Hiatt in memory of McGrory to be given to St. Ann's Infant and Maternity Home in Hyattsville, Md.

Metro reporter **David** Fallis has received the 2004 Heywood Broun Award given by the Newspaper Guild-CWA. He was honored for his four-part series

in May on poor conditions in Virginia's assisted living facilities. Fallis spent more than a year working on the project which uncovered repeated abuses and neglect in the facilities for the disabled and elderly. The series resulted in legislation passed by the Virginia General Assembly to improve conditions in the facilities. Fallis receives a \$5,000 prize with the award.

Foreign Correspondent Philip Pan is the winner of the Asia Society's Osborn Elliott Prize for Excellence in Asian Journalism. According to an announcement in The Post on April 1, Pan was honored for his "skill, daring and ingenuity" in covering China. Pan will receive a \$10,000 award on June 1 at the New York-based Asia Society.

Post Columnist William **Raspberry** was presented in February with the 2005 Richard Wright Award for Literacy Excellence for Non-Fiction. The award is presented each year to "Mississippans who have achieved distinction in a variety of literary endeavors." The award was presented at the Natchez, Miss. Literary and Cinema Celebration by the celebration's Richard Wright Awards Committee.

Raspberry was also honored by the American Civil Liberties Union Fund of the National Capital Area at its annual Bill of Rights Awards dinner on March 15. He was presented with the Edgerton Lifetime Achievement Award for his "steadfast pursuit of equality and justice."
