Get the Scoop on The Post's New Employee Orientation and 'Onboarding' Program

tarting a new job can be difficult and stressful.
Regardless of position, new employees need to feel welcome and have access to information that will help them get up to speed quickly.

The Post's new employee "onboarding" team recently completed a program to meet these needs and will deploy it on June 11. The Scoop is a three-part program designed to seamlessly acclimate employees to their new work environment and immerse them into The Post's culture.

The first part of the program occurs before the employees report for their first day of work. The newly hired employee is able to visit a website to print and complete employment forms and review important company information.

Part two of The Scoop entails a six-hour orientation offered on Mondays. During this session, the new employee is officially welcomed to The Post. They also learn about the company's culture and receive information to help them transition into the company. Additionally, they also receive their identification badge, an employee benefits overview, a tour of the Northwest facility and a summary of The Post's past, present and future vision.

The third part is a high-energy session offered on the first Wednesday of every month. During the session, the new employees participate in activities designed to provide them with more in-depth knowledge about The Post's culture and its most important processes.

At the beginning of the orientation process, the hiring manager and new employees receive orientation tools, including a hiring manager's checklist and a new employee guidebook.

In the past few weeks, managers had the opportunity to attend various information sessions that provided a preview of The Scoop.
