I once had a reputation of knowing a lot of people at this newspaper and these are the people I knew! We are seated in the old pressroom. This is where I met several of you for the first time... I have been here 37 and a half years and there are people who have been here years more than me and are retiring tonight... I just want to say that I feel the same combination of happiness and sadness that many other people in this room feel tonight.

I am so proud to have done all of this with you for so long. I will miss you and beg you all


