he Eugene Meyer
Awards are now in their
tenth year. The awards
were established on the 50th
anniversary of the purchase of
The Post at a bankruptcy sale
by Mr. Meyer and are presented to employees who exemplify the principles declared by
Mr. Meyer as essential conduct. The three employees

honored this year are LUBA FORBES of Advertising, PETER MILIUS of Editorial and BEN WHITTEMORE of Circulation.

The winners of the Eugene Meyer Awards are chosen by the Chairman of The Washington Post Company,

KATHARINE GRAHAM.

Graham said that her first

impression of Milius was less than favorable. It seems that while attending a dinner party, two of the guest were rather rambunctious children. In a 1943 letter to her husband, Philip Graham, she said, "'..it was a little distracting as we had to eat with Michael Rauh and Peter Milius, age 7.... We sat on the porch before dinner while Mr. Milius tore up and down on a tricycle, once clipping my chair and once running over my toes.' In the best

## Super Cause, Super Sale

he "Sold Out" sign was posted nearly two weeks before the big event. Eager shoppers had snapped up the 1800 available tickets for Super Sale well in advance of the June 5 sale and procrastinators were left empty-handed.

From modest beginnings, Super Sale has grown into a significant source of funds for the Nina Hyde Breast Cancer Research Center, Super Sale was begun as a tribute to Hyde, The Post's fashion editor until her death from breast cancer three years ago. The event has grown substantially each year, both in funds raised for breast cancer research and in the amount and quality of merchandise donated for the sale. After only three annual sales, Super Sale is becoming a "must attend" event.

As in past years, fashion designer and co-founder with The Post of the Nina Hyde Center, Ralph Lauren, along with Oscar de la Renta, Giorgio Armani, Donna Karan, Louis Dell'Olio of Anne Klein, and local retailers provided valuable support and merchandise.

The preliminary sales total is a whopping \$333,000, an increase of over 20 percent from last year and more than three times the amount raised at the first sale.

One in eight women will contract breast cancer. The funds raised at Super Sale all go toward the search for a cure for this disease. Thanks to all the dedicated Post employees who volunteered to work during Super Sale. Without you, this fundraiser would not have been possible.



sense, Peter has been stepping on peoples' toes ever since." Publisher and Company CEO DONALD GRAHAM said that Milius had the rare skill of translating the highly technical mechanics of government into plain language for the average reader.

Regarding Forbes, Mrs. Graham said, "Luba Forbes is one of my favorite people at The Post. She was one of the first women in a position of real responsibility whom I came to know, and respect, in

my early days as Publisher."
The current Publisher related that when he told Forbes she had won the award, she said, "I couldn't love this place more if I owned it." "With this award," said Graham, "we're saying, 'We know that."

If there's a blizzard, a late-breaking news story, or an Inaugural issue to plan, the person who needs to be contacted is Whittemore. Whittemore joined The Post in 1957 and has increased circulation wherever he was working. Mrs. Graham said of Whittemore, "Whenever there's trouble or a crisis in someone's family or personal life, Ben is there, organizing The Post's response. He is someone we look to automatically for leadership, particularly at times of special news events or special problems."



Perhaps Milius summed up the feelings of the three award recipients best when he said, "I can only remember a few days in 28 fiscal years that I haven't been excited about coming to The Post. When people come here to ask what we do, they always seem to go away a little envious. They envy the intellectual freedom that we have in what we do .... You don't always agree; sometimes you disagree rather vigorously, but you allow the process to go on.... With this award you have saluted me; I would like to salute you back."
