Hundreds of Staff Attend Monday's Eugene Meyer Awards

Hundreds of employees took the opportunity to enjoy the evening with friends and colleagues as they honored three of their own who received this year's Eugene Meyer Award.

The Eugene Meyer Award was established in 1983 to annually recognize one or more employees who exemplify the seven principles for running a newspaper established by Mr. Meyer in 1935. The 1999 recipients embody the qualities that have brought The Post through the last 66 years: good journalism, good business sense and hard work.

"Joe Rinaldi is the only person I know who has worked in all three major departments in Production," said Don Graham. "When he was paste-up supervisor he commanded the

respect of everyone who worked for him and you always knew that the paper would be done on time that night...A lot of this place was built by people like Joe."

"After 38 years, I'm still impressed with the people and crafts that come together each night to create this newspaper," commented Rinaldi, after accepting his award.

Graham then introduced 27-year employee and Assistant Managing Editor/Sports George Solomon. "George is one of the best sports editors of all time because he has put together the staff who puts out the best Sports section of all time."

In his speech Solomon noted that he figured out that he has to date put out about 9,000 Sports sections and attended 15,000 story conferences. He thanked many of the people he works with and has worked for, including former Sports Editor, the late Shirley Povich, "my mentor, who always said what a joy it is to work at The Washington Post."

Mary C. Williams has been working with Classified Advertising client Long & Foster since shortly after she came to The Post in 1970. Because of the exceptional work she has done for the growing real estate firm, many Long & Foster employees came to the awards reception to honor Williams.

"Every employee who comes into Classified soon learns the amazing story of Mary Williams," explained Graham. "She has handled many Long & Foster account since it was a small firm with only seven offices and now there are 139 offices, and guess who handles them all – Mary Williams."

Williams talked about her many families: her family at The Washington Post, her family including her husband, son, daughter-in-law, and two dogs, and her family at Long & Foster. "Classified Advertising has become a large family," she added. "We have gone through so much together."

She concluded with a favorite poem,"Life is a joy and all things show it, I thought so once, but now I know it."
